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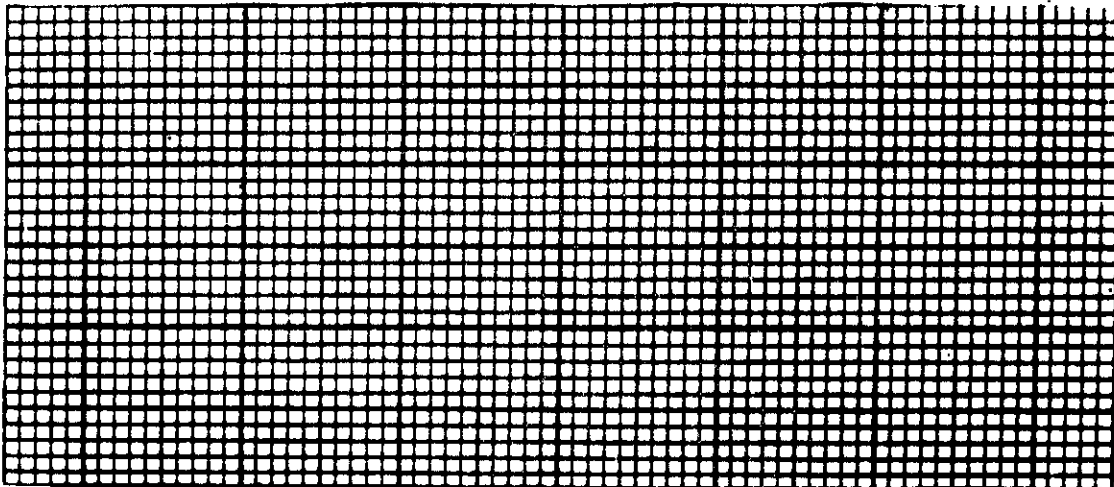

SUBJECT: Policy on Applicability of Meat Market Regulations

Since the Meat Market and Abattoir Law was originally passed in 1937, there have been many changes in industry practices, including the prepackaging of meats and poultry, and the subsequent selling of prepackaged meats and poultry by many stores. Existing policy is based upon an opinion of the Attorney General, which points out that our inspection authority does not extend to places which are merely retail outlets handling meat which has been processed and packaged elsewhere. We regard packaging as the end of processing.

The existing policy is that stores which limit their sales of meat and poultry to the following specific items are not subject to the meat market regulations:

1. Prepackaged meats and poultry, which has been inspected by USDA or NCDA. This means that all such items have been packaged at an abattoir, meat processing plant, poultry processing plant, or regular meat market prior to shipment to the retail establishment, and that packages may not be broken at the retail place.
2. Fat back and cured side meat which has been inspected by USDA or NCDA may be cut and sold.
3. Whole country-cured hams, shoulder and link sausage, which has been USDA or NCDA inspected.

SUBJECT: Solid Waste Disposal Regulations and Pesticide Use For the Control of
Insects and Rodents

The "Rules and Regulations Providing Standards for Solid Waste Disposal" were adopted by the North Carolina State Board of Health in March, 1971, presently Commission for Health Services, and they provide standards on a statewide basis for the storage, collection, and disposal of solid waste. The responsibility of enforcement is basically in two categories that involve both State and local health personnel. The personnel of the Solid Waste and Vector Control Branch will necessarily be required to enforce Section VIII through Section XIV since the approval of this agency is required. Local health personnel can provide assistance by the enforcement of those standards that apply to the storage, collection, and transportation of solid waste.

Due to the rapid changes in pesticide usage recommendations, it is recommended that the local health department consult personnel of the Solid Waste and Vector Control Branch regarding approved materials for vector control.

The following recommendations should be followed:

1. No pesticide shall be used that has not received the approval of the N. C. Department of Agriculture as required by the N. C. Pesticide Act of 1971.
2. The recommended use and mixing instructions that appear on the label shall be strictly adhered to at all times.

3. The use of pesticides shall be in accordance with the recommendations of the Solid Waste and Vector Control Branch. Where two materials are recommended, the least toxic shall be used.
