This position is located within the Occupational and Environmental Epidemiology Branch, which investigates workplace and environmental conditions that may pose a risk to human health. As part of the Division of Public Health, we provide evidence to support public health decisions and policy efforts across North Carolina. Environmental Program Consultant (EPC) will perform scientific activities and project management for the NC Building Resilient Environmental Health Capacity Program (BREHC) within the NC Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health.
